



AUTUMN REPORT



CO-HATY OBJECT IN TLUMACH

We've completed work on building the Ivano-Frankivsk Regional Center for Social Support of Children and Families.

The CO-HATY team:

- repaired the sewerage system and electrical networks, fire system;
- connected water to washing machines and boilers;
- partially replaced doors, locks and installed missing window handles;
- developed furniture design, curtains, and curtain rods for rooms, common spaces, kitchens, and dining rooms;
- added curtains to the bathrooms to separate showers and toilets;
- laid new tiles on the stairs in front of the entrance.

This building is prepared to accommodate 130 internally displaced persons.



DORMITORY OF IVANO-FRANKIVSK SPORTS LYCEUM

We finished another CO-HATY object in the fall. Our team furnished two common spaces, two medical rooms, and 38 room blocks with kitchen appliances and furniture.



DORMITORY OF THE INDUSTRIAL COLLEGE

The CO-HATY team is still working on the facility in Kamianets-Podilskyi.

In the autumn, we:

- completed the dismantling work;
- installed the heating system;
- repaired the water supply system and completed repairs in the bathrooms and kitchens in the left wing of the building.

We continue to repair utility networks, redesign common areas, and repair rooms and doors. We're also furnishing the rooms where residents move in with beds and other furniture.

The CO-HATY pilot project has been nominated for the European Union Prize for Contemporary Architecture – Mies van der Rohe Awards 2024. The prize recognizes architectural projects for their cultural and social impact, concept, and technical characteristics.

A documentary about CO-HATY, directed by Nazar Nazaruk, has been released on Ukrainer. The filming began in September 2022 when the director&camera-man arrived at the construction site and decided to start recording interviews with the team. This resulted in the movie **"To Love. To Make"**. About housing created with love. About people from different parts of the country coming together to help. And about how architecture can be a form of care.



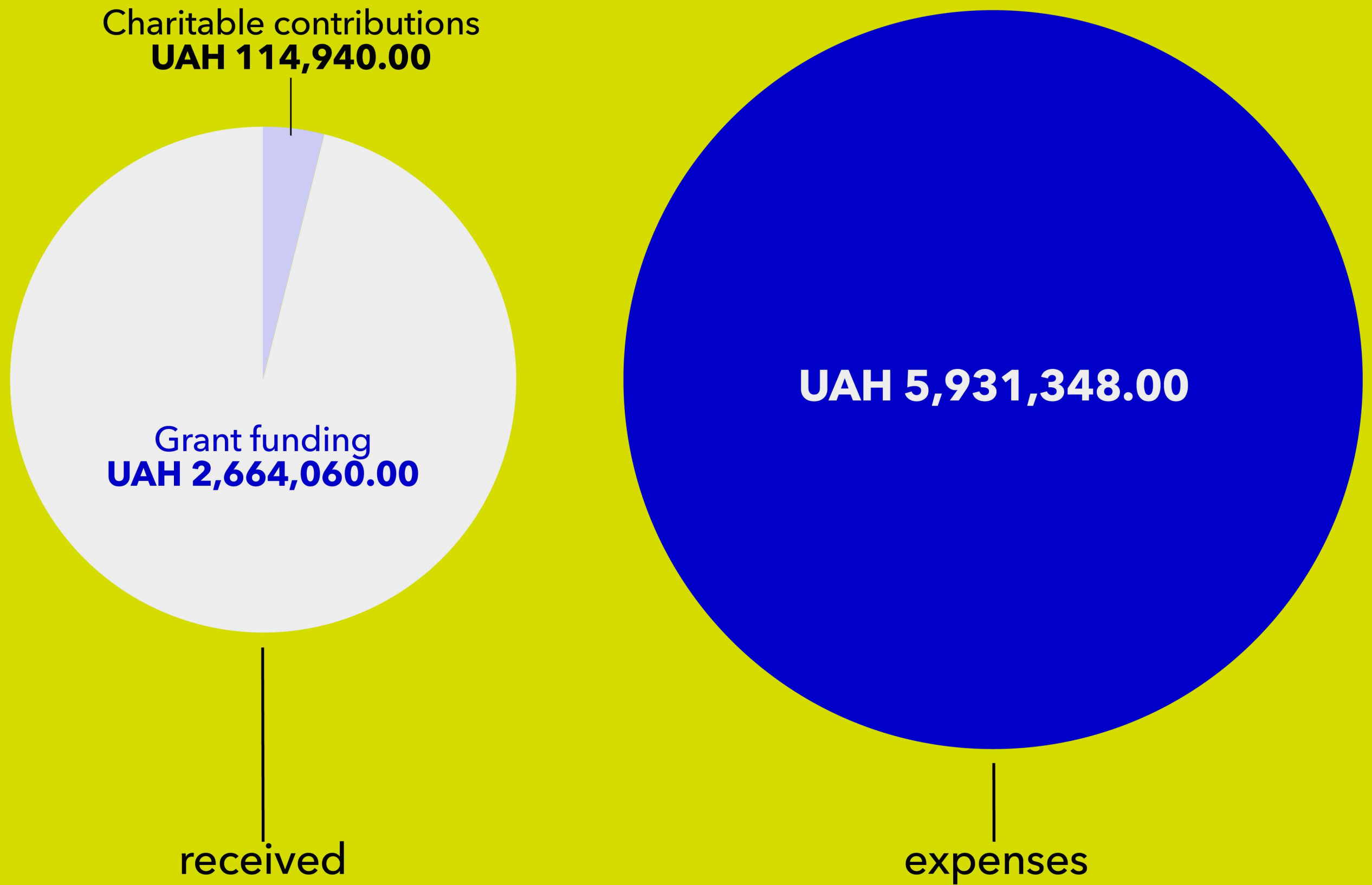
CO-HATY EVENTS

The stories about CO-HATY became part of The Beauty of Care project at the Venice Architecture Biennale, which our Ania and Tanya Pashynsky, Anna Dobrova, Yuliia Holiuk, and Yuliia Rusylo created.

Nastia Ponomariova curated the exhibition Doors to Ukraine. Designing for Urgency, dedicated to the reuse of doors in Ukraine and, in particular, the KO-HATY project. The event opened with a roundtable discussion with Anna Dobrova. At the close of the event, there was a screening of the movie "To Love. To Make". Nastia also presented a film about CO-HATY in Krakow at the Institute of Architecture.

Yuliia Rusylo and Anna Dobrova took part in a residency at the Akademie der Künste in Berlin. They initiated a project to document the history of CO-HATY in book format.

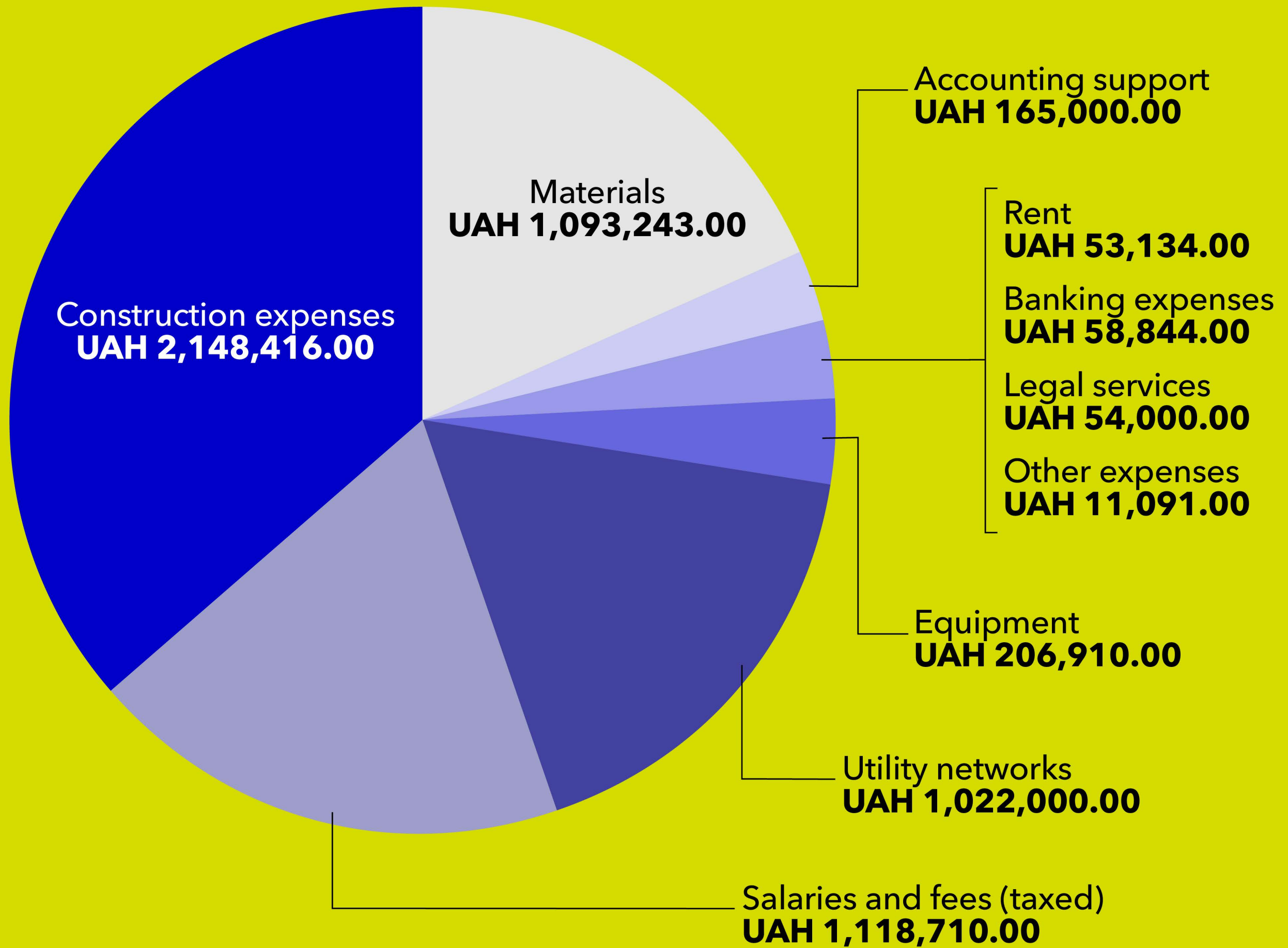
