# ABOUT THE RENOVATION OF THE FORMER HOTEL

Thanks to the fact that there were no power outages in the second half of February, we were able to complete minor repairs inside the hotel and in the dining room. At the same time, by purchasing an uninterruptible power supply, we prepared the boiler room for possible future outages.

## **Also in February, we:**

- set up a sample room with furniture, curtains, bedding and decor;
- installed curtain rods in the rooms and mirrors in the bathrooms;
- partially insulated the facade;
- installed the front door;
- paid for materials for the future terrace.

## WHAT ARE THE UPDATES AT ZINKIVTSI DORMITORY?

The repair works on floors 1-4 are in the final stages. **We have completed:**

- laying linoleum;
- painting rooms, bathrooms, kitchens and corridors;
- fitting doors and platbands;
- mounting plumbing fixtures in the bathrooms;
- installing sockets, switches and chandeliers;
- hoods mounting.

We are also completing the installation of boilers and assembling furniture for the rooms (beds, shelves, tables and chairs).

**In the common space, we:**

- installed partitions;
- painted the space;
- are installing plumbing and electrical fittings.

The first rooms are already arranged with furniture and textiles. Soon it will be the same for the entire building.



## **A 20-TON TRUCK OF MATERIALS AND FURNITURE**

We received a truck full of materials and furniture donated by our partners from Switzerland. Our colleagues Nastya Ponomaryova and Anna Dobrova initiated this process. The RE-WIN organization helped fill most of the truck with plumbing, linoleum and interior items. Another part of the cargo was furniture supplied by a housing cooperative in Zurich.



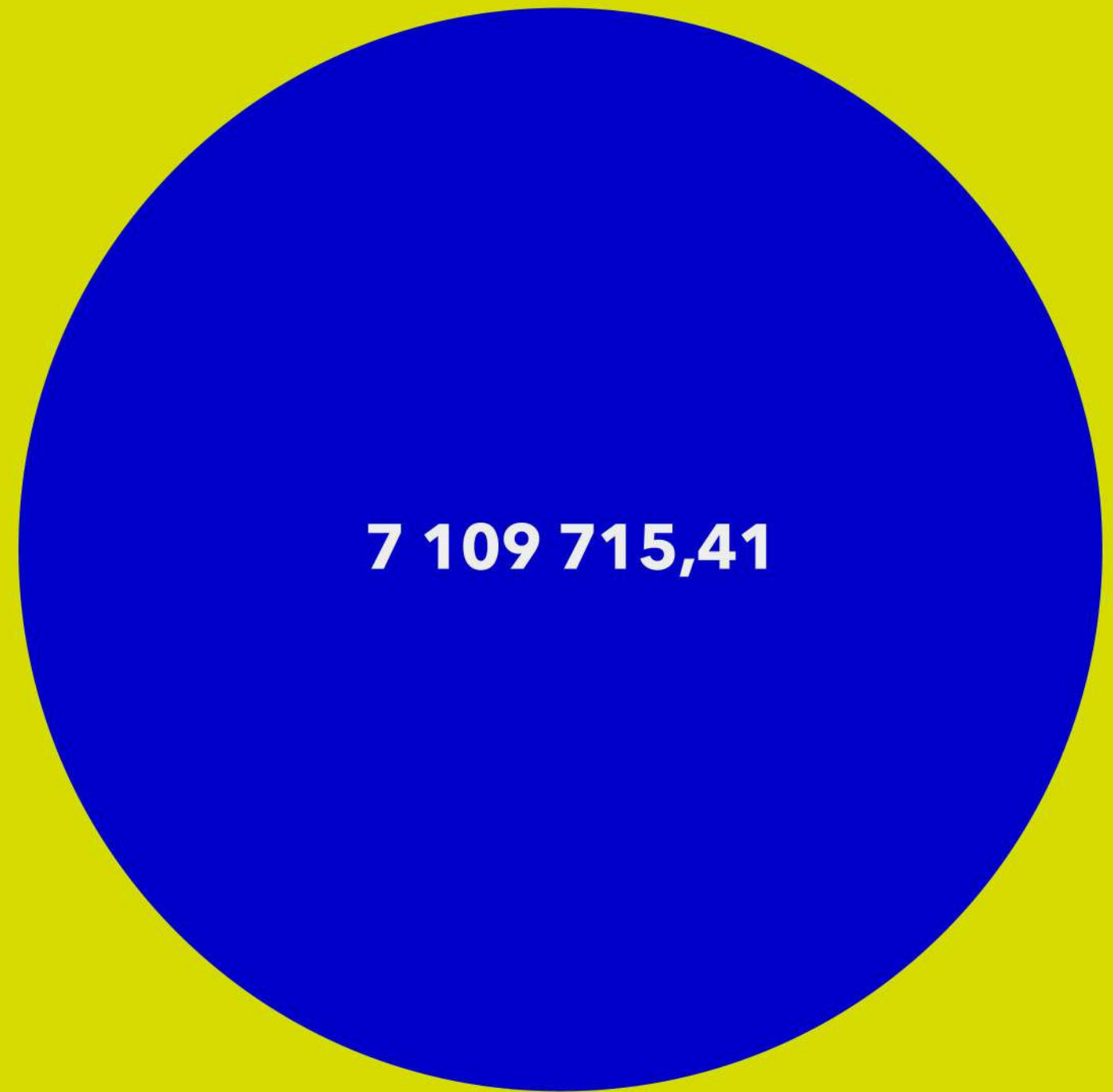
## CO-HATY EVENTS

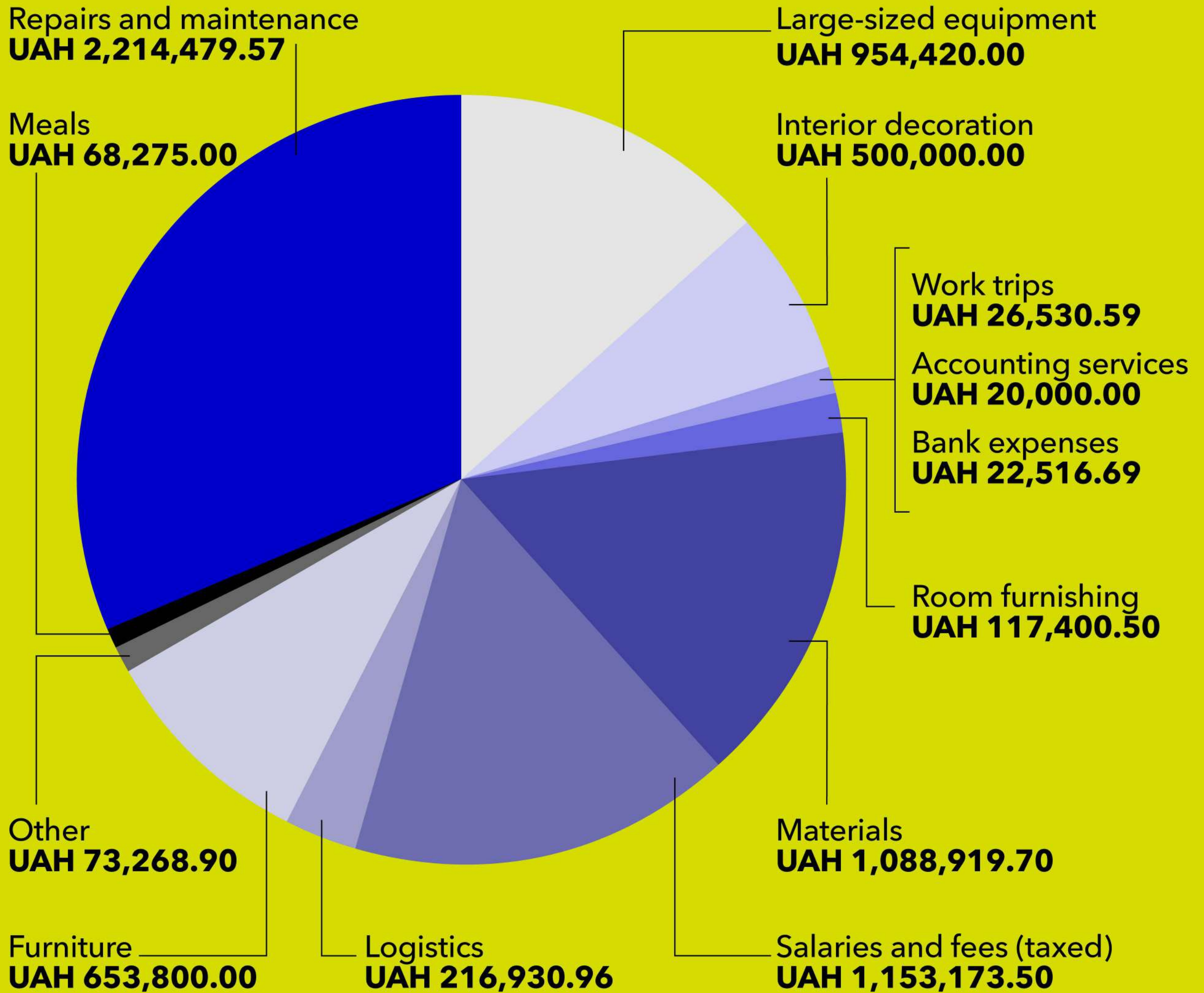
