OPENING OF CO-HATY HOUSING AT THE FORMER HOTEL

In March, we completed the re-planning, renovation, and furnishing of the former hotel to house 80 people in Ivano-Frankivsk. As of now, 50 IDPs have already moved into the building.



WHICH WORKS DID THE HOTEL RENOVATION INCLUDE?


- replacement of the heating system, including the boiler room installation;
- renovation of all utility systems and the roof;
- partial re-planning of larger rooms into block units;
- restoration of the dining room and furniture creation together with the TOLOCAR project;
- furnishing rooms with furniture and textiles;
- arrangement of a common kitchen and dining room, coworking space, children's playroom, and laundry room;
- facade insulation;
- development of the terrace project it will be built soon.

Having completed the work in the common space, we continued to arrange the rooms and prepare the building for residents to move in.

On March 22, 2022, we came to the first construction site, with neither money nor tools, but with a great desire to help. This is how the history of CO-HATY began.

- restored 3 buildings
- created housing for 400 internally displaced persons

CO-HATY: MEDIA AND EVENTS






In March, our income amounted to **UAH 23,370.00.**Of these, **UAH 10,260.00** were charitable donations, and **UAH 13,110.00** were other income.
