## **THE FORMER HOTEL BUILDING**

During the summer, we completed the insulation and painting of the facade of the former hotel building that became CO-HATY housing. Additionally, together with the residents, we started landscaping the surrounding area.



## **"FLOWER KIDS" CAMP**

This summer, our partners from the NE SAMI organization and the Volunteer Home charitable foundation organized two three-day camps for children residing in CO-HATY housing near Kamianets-Podilskyi and in Ivano-Frankivsk.



## Zinkivtsi

35 children aged 3 to 16 years old

### Activities:

- made traditional Ukrainian rag dolls (motanky);
- decorated T-shirts, painted, and did beadwork;
- participated in a quest game;
- explored an old fortress.

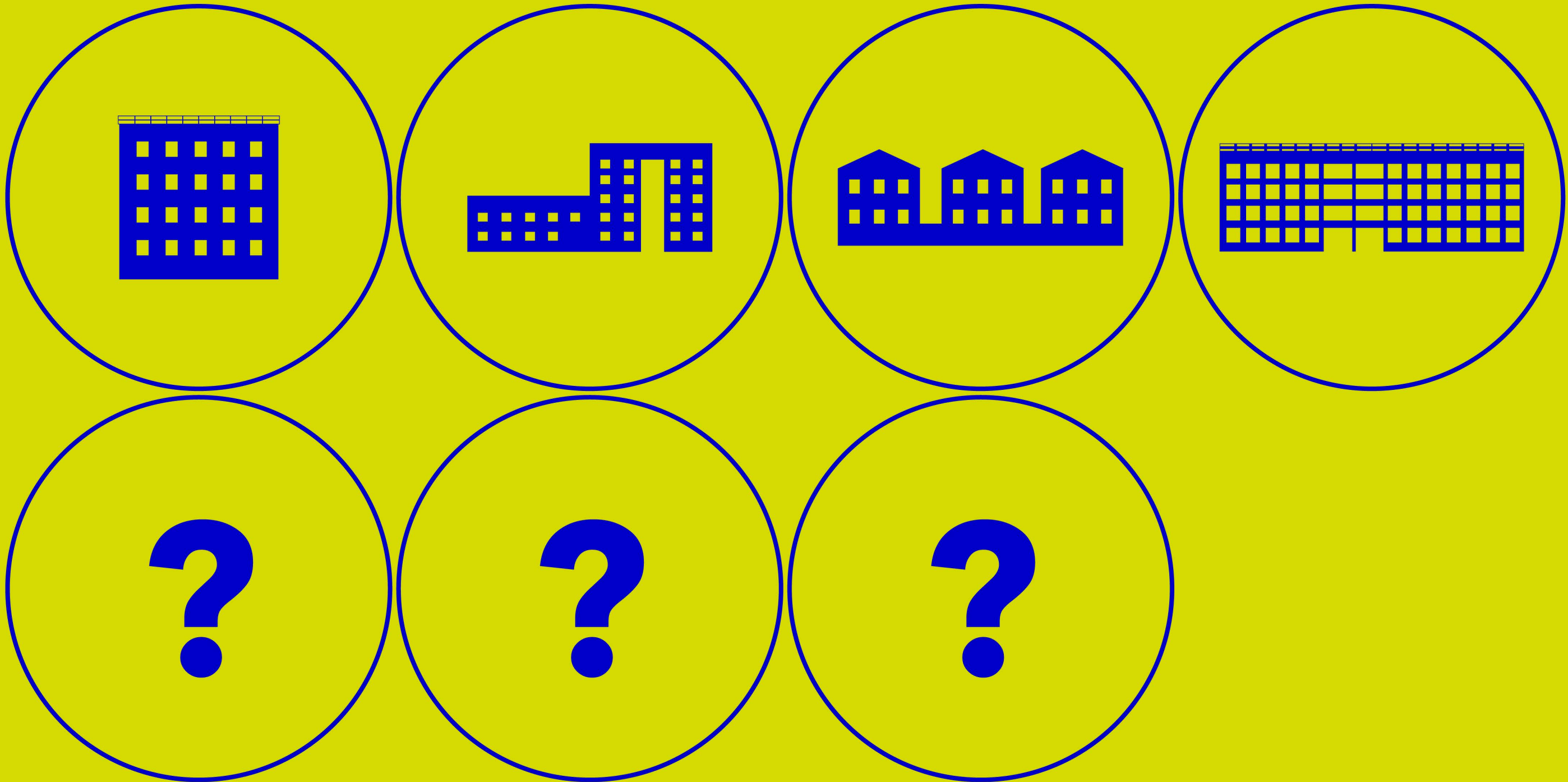
## Ivano-Frankivsk

20 children aged 6 to 17 years old

### Activities:

- attended "lessons" in history, Ukrainian language, and music;
- painted, and created art with clay and plasticine;
- took part in a quest game and enjoyed "fun races";
- watched animated films.

## **NEW CO-HATY SITES**

During this summer, we began work on three new CO-HATY sites in Ivano-Frankivsk, Tlumach, and Kamianets-Podilskyi. These buildings will provide housing for 730 internally displaced people.



## **Dormitory of Ivano-Frankivsk Sports Lyceum on Yunosti Street**

- accommodating 450 IDPs
- furnishing and equipping kitchens, common areas, and medical offices



## **Building of Ivano-Frankivsk Regional Center for Social Support of Children and Families in Tlumach**

- accommodating 130 IDPs
- setting up rooms, kitchens, dining areas, shared spaces, and bathrooms
- repairs to the sewage system, fire safety system, and electrical network



## **Dormitory of Industrial College in Kamianets-Podilskyi**

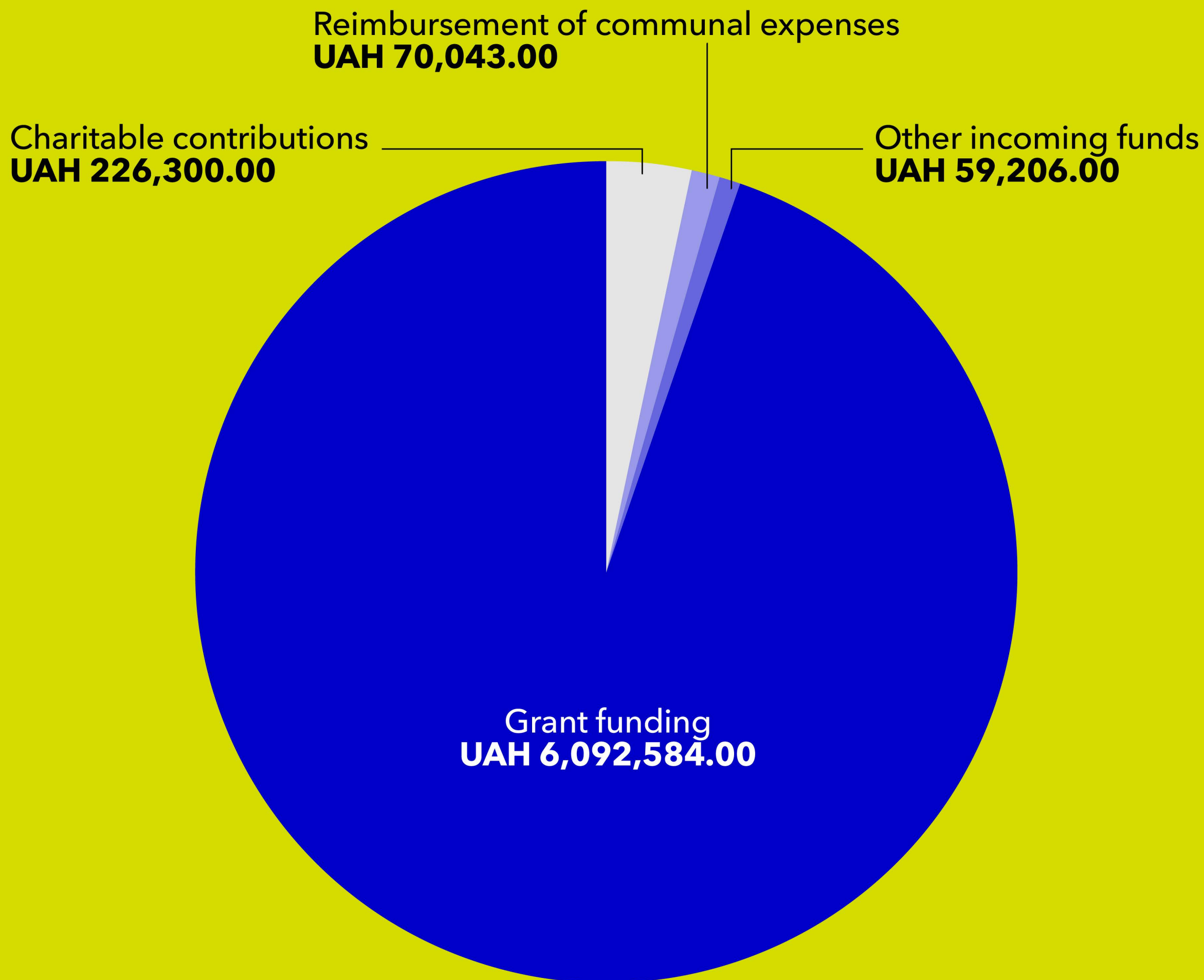
- accommodating 150 IDPs
- repairs to heating, electrical, sewage, and water supply systems
- renovation of rooms, kitchens, common areas, bathrooms, and laundry facilities
