



CO-HATY HOUSING NEAR KAMIANETS-PODILSKYI IS COMPLETED!

In April, we finished the renovation and furnishing of the former dormitory in Zinkivtsi, and the first residents have already moved in.



WHICH WORKS DID THE RENOVATION OF ZINKIVTSI DORMITORY INCLUDE?

This building had not been used for 20 years, so there were many tasks for our team:

- restoration of external and internal utility systems (heating, electricity, water supply, and sewage);
- partial re-planning;
- roof repair;
- installing new windows and doors;
- interior finishing works;
- furnishing the rooms with furniture and household appliances;
- new fire alarm system;
- adaptation of part of the first floor for the needs of people with disabilities.



HOW IS CO-HATY HOUSING AT THE FORMER HOTEL FUNCTIONING?

The residents are already forming a community. Together, they cleaned the territory by the building, removed garbage, formed flower beds, and planted flowers. They also organize joint leisure activities for children and help each other.

The residents also receive support from charitable and social organizations, including the Right to Protection Fund, Rokada, Doctors Without Borders, Save the Children, the Ukrainian Red Cross Society, and a social project by L'Oreal.


CO-HATY EVENTS




In April, our incomes amounted to **UAH 12,236.00** of charitable contributions.
